Font Comparison

Note: "ti" as in "Kai ti" means "style" or "font." Among these fonts, "Song" is the most commonly used printing font. Almost all Chinese books printed in Mainland China use "Song ti."

Answer Key for Reading Comprehension

- 1. 开车从北 jīng dào 上 hǎi yào duō 长 shí 问? How long does it take to drive from Beijing to Shanghai? (Lit. "Drive car from Beijing to Shanghai need how long time?")
- 2. 你从东门进来,北门坏了。 Come in through the east gate/door. The north gate/door is broken. (Lit. "You from east door come in, north gate broken.")
- 3. 我一年 yào 出 guó 三 cì,每 cì 十天左右。 I have to go abroad three times a year for about 10 days each time. (Lit. "I one year need go abroad three times, every time ten days about.")

Answer Key for Real Life Reading Practice

The **RED** character(s) are the ones you should recognize. Picture 1

Taxi (lit. "Rent out car")

(It can be difficult to get a taxi during rush hour, but there are over 66,000 taxis running in Beijing and it's a convenient and relatively inexpensive way to get around the city.)
