*Note: "ti" as in "Kai ti" means "style" or "font." Among these fonts, "Song" is the most commonly used printing font. Almost all Chinese books printed in Mainland China use "Song ti."*

## Answer Key for Reading Comprehension

A lot of people only drink water when they're thirsty, which is not right. Drinking water when you're thirsty is bad for the body. When you wake up every morning, it's best if your first drink water, then eat. Don't drink too much water, 1200ml each time at most.

(Lit. A lot of people thirsty only then go drink water, this is not right. When you thirsty when then drink water, toward body very bad. Every day morning get up had best first drink water, and then eat. Drinking water also don't too much, every time at most 1200 ml.)
